New Tractor:

Since the inception of Sailability Bayside, we have relied on the generosity of our volunteers to have a suitable vehicle onsite each sailing day to launch and recover the support boat. On most occasions that has not been a problem, though there has been occasions when it became necessary to use whatever vehicle was available in order to run the day and while there was never any issue, it did present some concern.



Earlier this year, a generous supporter offered to fund a project to improve our operation and the purchase of a small 4X4 tractor was suggested. Thanks to our benefactor, we were then able to progress that suggestion whereby we are now the proud owners of a John Deere tractor capable of launching and recovering the support boat and this tractor is also equipped with a mowing attachment to trim the large grassed areas within our shared facility. We are extremely grateful to our benefactor and also to the tractor supplier, RDO Equipment who ensured we obtained the machine at a very good price.

Fielders Club Raffles:



Skipper's Regatta:




